OPENING OR CLOSING CHURCH MEETINGS

Scripture passages that could be used to open or close church meetings

- **John 2:5** His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: Wedding at Cana. Running low on wine. Mary, asks Jesus for help. He is hesitant but Mary is so confident of his ability that she instructs the servants to do whatever he says. We will need that same confidence in Jesus and that same willingness to obey if we are going to be used effectively by God.
- **I Corinthians 3:9** For we are God's servants, working together ...
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: Paul, explaining that both he and Apollos have a role. They are not in competition. God gives the growth. We all have different tasks but all to one goal ... to change lives and to change the world through Jesus Christ.
- **I Corinthians 12:4-7** Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; 5 and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; 6 and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. 7 To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: Everyone has something to contribute to the task at hand.
- **I Corinthians 16:13-14** Keep alert, stand firm in your faith, be courageous, be strong. 14 Let all that you do be done in love.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: We may have to make tough, even unpopular decisions at time, but they must be made and lived out in a context of faith AND love.
- **Philippians 1:6** I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: God is at work in and through us and God will not let us down.
- **Matthew 5:16** In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: We do these good things to serve others in Jesus' name and to bring glory to God not to bring glory to ourselves.
- **Titus 2:7-8** Show yourself in all respects a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, gravity, 8 and sound speech that cannot be censured; then any opponent will be put to shame, having nothing evil to say of us.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: We represent Jesus. We represent the Church. The decisions we make and how we make them will make a difference in how people see Jesus and His Church.
- **Philippians 4:13** I can do everything through him who gives me strength.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: Our mission at WC is to change lives and change the world **through Jesus Christ**. We don't attempt to do these things through our own power but rather we count on the power of Jesus.
- **John 10:10** I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: What can we (*our committee, council, board, task force, team*) do to help people have the abundant life Jesus came to give?
- **I Peter 2:9-10** But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. **10** Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.
CONTEXT/APPLICATION: We are all chosen--- those who are part of the Body of Christ. But we here --- on this team, this committee, this task force ---- have been chosen for a particular ministry. You are not here by accident. God has placed you on this team. You are chosen. Think for a moment about why?
